During the bankruptcy our membership was it its highest point just under 7000, the total membership now stands at 4297. We now have 346 total members or associates 90 years old or older, and 29 are 100 years old or older. Our current oldest member is Reginald LeBlanc Retired Fire Lt, 104 years old, DOB 3/31/1921 lives in Yale, MI. There are three other members that are also 104 years old born later in 1921, Irene Doench 7/10/1921 Police Assoc, Dorothy Neil 9/21/1921 Fire Assoc, and Helen O'Brien 10/13/1921 Fire Assoc. It's great to see so many of our members living longer and hopefully healthy lives.

I hope everyone is doing well and you enjoyed the summer months with family and friends but fall has arrived so the adjustments will start and the planning for those fall and winter trips to warmer climates are in the planning stages. Our members that are already residing in the warmer areas enjoy and think of the rest of us. It won't be that long before the holidays are upon us.

I will start with some pension updates. The first is the pension system is doing very well with the stock market hitting all-time highs.

Also, the City is making their required contributions quarterly which helps with the cash flow. The City, in its annual budget, included a 10 million dollar distribution for retirees, both General and Police & Fire, which has been approved by City Council. The distribution will be split between both funds. The 5 million for Police and Fire will be distributed in the December 1st pension check. This is the same type of additional distribution that we received in May of this year. The amount will be similar to what you received on that check. The average amount was around \$600.00 plus or minus a few dollars. At that time I received a few calls from members concerning the amount of Michigan tax that was deducted from their check. It is unknown if that will happen again from this distribution, so just keep that in mind at tax filing time.

Moving on with the Association news, by the time you read this article the event at Soaring Eagle Resort & Casino will be over. Although the numbers were down some this year, I am sure the members who attended had a great time and hopefully some hit it big.

The next General Meeting will be Thursday December 4th at the east side location, The Polish Century Banquet Center, hope to see many of you there to help kick off the Holiday Season.

The Association again this year will have the Annual Picnic and General Meeting breakfast in Frankenmuth. The picnic will be on Monday June 15, 2026 with the meeting and breakfast on Tuesday the 16th. There will be the normal Hospitality Rooms in the evening on Sunday the 14th and Monday the 15h. The rooms will be the same price as this year @ \$139.00 plus tax and resort fee. There will be a lot more information as time moves on and we will keep everyone informed.

In the previous issue, Summer 162, the election procedures for nominations of Retired Detroit Police and Firefighters Association board positions were provided. All eight of the positions ran unopposed; President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, Sergeant at Arms (2) and Trustee (3). The terms for the elected offices are 1-1-2026 / 12-31-2028. The primary objective is to provide the members with information concerning the status of Pensions, Hospitalization and Insurances and to keep the members informed on all matters relative to the best interests of the Association and its members.

The Association will continue to organize five meetings in a calendar year, two General Membership meetings on the west side at the American Legion Carl E. Stitt Post 232 23850 Military Rd., Dearborn Heights (313) 274-8298 (the first Thursday in March and October) and two on east side at the American Polish Century 33204 Maple Lane Sterling Heights (586) 264-7990 (the first Thursday in May and December). The fifth meeting will be in Frankenmuth in June (date to be announced). The Association operates exclusively for the purpose set forth in Section 501 (c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The returning Board is familiar with the activities of the Association participating in a monthly board meet-

ing. An agenda as stated in the By-Laws are followed with all reports presented and reviewed. Association for 2026 will begin the new term in good shape. I am frequently asked about our membership numbers, presently the RDPFFA membership is just over four thousand (3,551 on payroll deduction / 511 not eligible for payroll deduction).

Membership remains to be a concern, addressing the matter, I am printing information from one my past issues. Our Association joins hundreds and probably thousands of social clubs across the United States struggling with growing their membership numbers. For example: Fraternal Orders of Association along with a number of other Societies and many other non-profit groups. For instance, VFW, American Legion, P.L.A.V., also numerous common interest fraternities all seem to have this dilemma.

Attitudes and outlooks have changed from the past generation that used to get involved with voluntary groups or unions. Regrettably, I cannot explain the change or why it happened, but we need to find a way to inform members and convey our message. All members will benefit from our past and future achievements and the Association's efforts tend to go unnoticed. A positive approach must be created explaining the need for increased membership which will strengthen our financial position to maintain our purpose. The \$3.00 per month payment to the Association is such a small price to pay for all of the benefits received.



DEATH OF MEMBER FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROCEDURE

Communications vary whether member was Police, Fire, or Sergeant and above. If you are Police make your first call to the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association, (313) 870-9304. Followed by either a call to the Detroit Police Officer Association, (313) 567-8770, or the Lieutenants & Sergeants (313) 961-5699, which ever applies.

While the Detroit Police Benefit & Protective Association will normally contact the City of Detroit with the information it would be reasonable to follow up with a call to the Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 Ext. 221 or 1 (800) 339-8344 and BeneSys (833) 725-5336 to make sure that they were notified. Last but not least, notify the Retired Detroit Police & Fire Fighters Association, (586) 795-1734.

Fire employees, start by notifying the Detroit Fire Fighter Association, (313) 962-7546, the Detroit Firemen's Fund Association, (313) 628-0099, Detroit Fire Mutual Fund call Firemen's Fund Association to leave a message, and the Detroit Pension Bureau, (313) 224-3362 or (800) 339-8344, ext 221.

The above agencies will assist you with the notification process. It would be a good idea to put this information with your secured legal documents or some other obvious place where your survivors can locate it.


